Profile: WSU junior Cedric Mutebi, "Warrior Strong" personified

Cedric Mutebi, at 18, was confronted with the public health challenges that shaped his professional ambitions. Volunteering at Detroit Receiving Hospital, the aspiring physician had to deliver unthinkable news to a young man barely a year older than him.

"He came to the emergency department just trying to get treatment," recalled Mutebi. "It turns out his symptoms were from HIV. For me, in that instant, looking at this young black man who looks like me and having to tell him that he had HIV, I went from just *wanting* to do this work to someone who was now *in it*.

"All that emotion – all that pain, confusion, anger – was the most significant experience I've had at Wayne State. It was incredibly tragic, but also transformational. The magnitude of that moment spoke to the reasons why I do what I do, because I know the health disparities associated with my community. And that's what I want to do: To change the culture of health, from an African American standpoint and from a global standpoint."

Many young people dream of changing the world; Mutebi has a head start – at Wayne State and beyond. Now a junior, Mutebi is a standardbearer for excellence at the university – a source of pride, affirmation and high expectation. He is in promotional video clips, on posters, and numerous other vehicles celebrating the Warrior Strong ethos. In December, Mutebi was chosen to be the first student to pose a question to former first lady Michelle Obama during her impromptu meeting with a group of young black men from Wayne State.

He is a scholar in the top-flight Wayne Med Direct – the cuttingedge initiative that embeds undergraduate students in the School of Medicine on a fast-track to M.D. He recently led an effort to train 1,040 people for the university's participation in the statewide Hands-Only CPR Challenge – earning the university First Place.

Mutebi also works in on-campus mentorship. He helped found The Brotherhood, an organization of young men of color, tutoring and mentoring children through the Downtown Boxing Gym Youth Program. He's active in Wayne State's Warrior VIP program, providing wraparound services to encourage student success. He works with Provost Keith Whitfield on new community engagement strategies, and sits on the board of the American Heart Association Heart Walk Cabinet.

Mutebi, planning to graduate in May 2019, helps his mother – a registered nurse who immigrated from Uganda to the U.S. with Mutebi's accountant father in 1989 – with an overseas relief program she established nearly 15 years ago – Opening Doors, assisting Ugandans battling learning disabilities. Mutebi has been helping his mom with the program since he was about 8.

"Opening Doors is a home for children with learning and physical disabilities," he said. "In Uganda, when people have kids who are disabled, they can feel like God is punishing them for something they did, so those kids are often pushed to the side, mistreated, neglected. Our facility is a place where these children can go without feeling stigmatized. "That was my first touch point with medicine and the first reason why I started to pursue it as a career. It's hard, but we try to help people. I like being able to see that, and being able to impact lives."

This ambition drew Mutebi to Wayne State, but the decision wasn't exactly cut and dried. A topnotch athlete at University of Detroit Jesuit High School – his brother Nick played basketball at Wayne State – he earned a number of college athletic scholarship offers, including the University of Michigan. Things began to change after a family friend brought Mutebi to campus and facilitated a personal meeting with President M. Roy Wilson.

"I thought it was kind of cool to be able to sit down with the president and chop it up," said Cedric. "President Wilson didn't press the issue. He just asked what I was looking for in a school, trying to see what I wanted to do. Now I had this opportunity to pursue medicine debt-free, or I could pursue my childhood dream of playing college football," he said.

The next month was full of sleepless nights and lots of conversations with people, trying to figure out what was the best route. Everyone was pretty much saying, 'Follow your heart, just do whatever you really want to do – either way, you will end up where you need to be." When Mutebi later learned that he had been accepted into the Wayne-Med Direct program, he made the difficult decision to forego college sports in favor of full-throated pursuit of a career in medicine.
